To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Wilson Sloope, Assignee of William Alexander Welch,
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte,
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William Alexander Welch,
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" for
the West half of the South-West quarter of Section thirty, in Township thirty-seven, North, of Range five, West
of the Second Meridian, in the District of lands subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing eighty acres
and eleven hundredths of an acre,
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said William Alexander Welch.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Wilson Sloope
and to his heirs, the said tract above described:

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said
Wilson Sloope
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
