

# The United States of America,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas James Rich Mendenhall and Joseph Watson, of Union County, Indiana, have deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said James Rich Mendenhall and Joseph Watson, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 21th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the Lot or fraction of the North West quarter (North of the Indian Boundary line), of Section thirty five, in Township thirty seven, North, of Range six, West, in the District of lands subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing one hundred and twenty five acres and two one hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said James Rich Mendenhall and Joseph Watson.

**NOW KNOW YE,** That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said James Rich Mendenhall and Joseph Watson and to their heirs, the said tract above described. To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said James Rich Mendenhall and Joseph Watson and to their heirs and assigns forever, as tenants in common, and not as joint tenants

In testimony whereof, I, Martin Van Buren, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
