To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Cary Johnson, of Hamilton County, Indiana, Ohio
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Leavenworth
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Cary Johnson
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the south west quarter of section twenty three, in township thirty seven, north, of Range five West, of the second Meridian in the
District of lands subject to sale at Leavenworth, Indiana, containing one hundred and sixty acres
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said Cary Johnson

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Cary Johnson
and to his heirs the said tract above described.
To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
Cary Johnson
and to his heirs and assigns forever.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto
affixed.
