Whereas Jacob Hoggomou of Elkhart County Indiana
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Jacob Hoggomou
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 2d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the East half of the South West quarter of Section twenty six, in Township thirty six
 Range five, East of the Second Meridian, in the District of Indiana subject to
 sale at La Porte Indiana containing eighty acres
 according to the official plan of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said Jacob Hoggomou.

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Jacob
 Hoggomou and to his heirs the said tract above described:
 To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
 Jacob Hoggomou and to his heirs and assigns forever.
