the North half of the North East-quarter of section one in Township thirty-seven, South of Range
five, West of the second Meridian, in the District of Texas subject to sale at La Plata, Indiana, con-
taining eighty-one acres and fourteen hundredths of an acre
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said Solow Johnstone, Fisher Ames, George Ames, and John J Foster.

several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Solow

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
Solow Johnstone, Fisher Ames, George Ames, and John J Foster and to their heirs and assigns forever.
