Whereas Samuel Taylor Marshall, of Butler County, Ohio, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at St. Louis, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Samuel Taylor Marshall according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> ~~lot~~ <sup>fractional section</sup> ~~containing~~ <sup>containing</sup> twelve acres and forty seven hundredths of an acre, <sup>in Township Kirby, eight North of Range five, West of the second Meridian, in the District of lands subject to sale at St. Louis</sup> ~~Indian~~ <sup>Indian</sup>, containing twelve acres and forty seven hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Samuel Taylor Marshall

**NOW KNOW YE,** That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Samuel Taylor Marshall and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said Samuel Taylor Marshall and to his heirs and assigns forever.
