To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas John Beal Steenberger and George W. Allen, Assignees of John Walker have deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John Walker according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the tenth tract the tenth tract quarter of section six, in Township thirty-four, North of Range five, West of the Second Meridian in the District of Indiana, subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing eighty-two acres, and thirty-seven hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said John Walker.

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said John Beal Steenberger and George W. Allen and to their heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said John Beal Steenberger and George W. Allen and to their heirs and assigns forever, as tenants in common and not as joint tenants.
