To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Charles Ketchen, of La Porte County, Indiana,
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Charles Ketchen,
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the East half of the South West quarter of section nineteen, in Township Thirty-four, 10th of Range five, West, of the second Meridian
in the District of Indiana subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing eighty acres,
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said Charles Ketchen.

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Charles
Ketchen.

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
Charles Ketchen, and to his heirs, the said tract above described:

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
