To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Charles Wetchen, of La Porte County, Indiana, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Charles Wetchen, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 25th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the East half of the South West quarter of Section six, Township thirty four, North of Range five, West of the second Meridian in the District of Sandy, subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing eighty acres,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Charles Wetchen

**NOW KNOW YE,** That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Charles Wetchen and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Charles Wetchen and to his heirs and assigns forever.
