Whereas *Jacob Parker Assignee of Lewis Miles Clark*
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at *La Porte*
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Lewis Miles Clark*
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the West half of the South East quarter of section thirty one, in Township thirty four, North of Range five West, in
the District of Lands subject to sale at *La Porte, Indiana*, containing eighty acres.

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Lewis Miles Clark*

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the promises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said *Jacob Parker*
