Whereas Joseph Bailey of La Porte County, Indiana,
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Joseph Bailey
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the Lot number three, of Section thirty-four, in Township thirty-seven North, of Range six West,
 in the District of lands subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing sixty acres and ninety
 three hundred and eight acres of an acre
 according to the official plan of the survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said Joseph Bailey

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Joseph
 Bailey and to his heirs the said tract above described.

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
 Joseph Bailey and his heirs and assigns forever.
