Whereas Willard Alia Place of LaPorte County Indiana
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Willard Alia Place
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

subject to sale at La Porte Indiana Containing ^{acres} Sixty-five & eighty-five hundredths of an acre

several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Willard

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said
Willard Alia Place and to his heirs and assigns forever.
