To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Calvin Fletcher & Nicholas H. Carty of Marion County Indiana have deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Calvin Fletcher & Nicholas H. Carty according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the South West quarter of Section thirty one in Township thirty six North of Range six West in the district of land subject to sale at La Porte Indiana containing one hundred and sixteen acres and twenty seven hundredths of an acre according to the official plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Calvin Fletcher & Nicholas H. Carty.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Calvin Fletcher & Nicholas H. Carty and to their heirs the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Calvin Fletcher & Nicholas H. Carty, and to their heirs and assigns forever, as tenants in common and not as joint tenants.
