Whereas Noah Newell, assignee of John Taylor of Laporte County Indiana,
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Laporte
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John Taylor
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 25th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" for
the East half of the South West quarter, of section thirty six, in Township thirty five North of range Six
West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Laporte, Indiana, containing Eighty Acres.
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said John Taylor.

several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Noah Newell
and to his heirs the said tract above described:
To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
Noah Newell and to his heirs and assigns forever.
