WHEREAS Daniel Low and Nathan Wood Low of La Porte County, Indiana

has deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** of the United States, a Certificate of the **REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE** at La Porte whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Daniel Low and Nathan Wood Low

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the West half of the North East quarter of Section twenty-seven, in Township thirty eight North, of Range three West, and the South East quarter of the South West quarter of Section ten, in Township thirty seven North, of Range five West, in the District of lands subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing one hundred and twenty acres,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said Daniel Low, and Nathan Wood Low

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED,** and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT,** unto the said Daniel Low and Nathan Wood Low

and to their heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Daniel Low and Nathan Wood Low

and to their heirs and assigns forever. as tenants in common and not as joint tenants
