To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

**WHEREAS** Nathan Wood Low, of La Porte County, Indiana,

has deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** of the United States, a Certificate of the **REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE** at La Porte whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Nathan Wood Low

according to the provisions of

the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

the East half of the North West quarter of Section five; the North East quarter of Section eleven, in Township thirty six North, of Range six West; And Lot Number three South of the Indian Boundary Line, of Section thirty three, in Township thirty seven North, of Range six West, in the District of lands subject to Sale at La Porte Indiana, containing two hundred and eighty three acres, and seventy four hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said Nathan Wood Low,

**NOW KNOW YE**, That the

**United States of America**, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED**, and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT**, unto the said Nathan Wood Low

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Nathan Wood Low,

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
