To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS Channey Buckler Blair and Jeremiah Atkins, of La Porte County, Indiana,

have deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** of the United States, a Certificate of the **REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE** at La Porte

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Channey Buckler Blair and Jeremiah Atkins according to the provisions of

the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

the West half of the North West quarter of Section twenty four, in Township thirty seven North of Range five West, in the District of lands subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing eighty acres.

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said Channey Buckler Blair and Jeremiah Atkins

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED,** and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT,** unto

the said Channey Buckler Blair and Jeremiah Atkins

and to their heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

Buckler Blair and Jeremiah Atkins and to their heirs and assigns forever. as tenants in common and not as joint tenants
