the West half of the North West quarter of Section thirty five in Township thirty six North, of Range seven West, of the second Principal Meridian, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Winamac, Indiana, containing Eighty Acres.

United States of America, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED,** and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT,** unto the said *Robert Harrison*

and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

Robert Harrison

and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.
