Whereas Alice A. Bandit, of Marion County, Indiana

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of THE REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at Indianapolis, Indiana, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Alice A. Bandit

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the last numbered power of Section Twenty-five in Township thirty Seven North of Range Seven West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Indianapolis, Indiana, containing forty-eight and twenty seven hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said Alice A. Bandit.

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Alice A. Bandit

and to her heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Alice A. Bandit

and to her heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made PATENT, and the SEAL of the GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
