according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the Lot, numbered one, in the *South East* quarter, of the *North East* quarter, and the fractional *North East* quarter, of the *North East* quarter, of Section twenty nine, in Township *Forty Seven North*, of Range *Six West*, in the district of *land subject to sale at Indianapolis, Indiana*, containing *forty eight acres and ninety hundredths of an acre*.

and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Lazarus Silberman*

and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.
