WHEREAS, John Shultz of Porter County, Indiana,

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Winamac, Indiana, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John Shultz

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the East half of the North West quarter of Section thirty one, in Township thirty four North, of Range five West of the Second Principal Meridian in Indiana, containing eighty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said John Shultz

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said

John Shultz and to

his heirs, the said Tract above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said John Shultz

and to his heirs and assigns forever. This Patent is issued in lieu of one bearing the same number, dated July 1, 1852, which has been canceled, and in which the Range was erroneously described as five East.

In testimony whereof I, Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
