To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 34,838 for 80 acres in favor of Catharine Brunnemer widow of Conrad Brunnemer, private Captain Rowlands Company, Virginia Militia, Mar 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the East half of the South east quarter of Section twenty one in Township thirty seven North of Range Six West in the dis trict of Lands subject to sale at Indianapolis Indiana, containing sixty seven acres and eighty two hundredths of an acre,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said Warrant having been assigned by the said Catharine Brunnemer to Eliza A. R. Francis in whose favor said tract has been located,

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

Eliza A. R. Francis, as assigned as aforesaid, and to her heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Eliza A. R. Francis, as assigned, as aforesaid and her

heirs and assigns forever.
