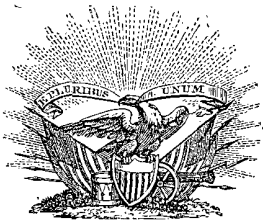

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 37,494 for 40 acres,

issued in favor of *Zenas Brown, Private in Captain Shattuck's Company, Massachusetts, United Mar. 1812*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *North East quarter of the North West quarter of Section Thirty four, in Township Thirty four, of Range Seven West, in the District of land subject to sale at Winamac Indiana containing Forty acres,*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *Which said warrant has been by said Zenas Brown duly assigned to Josephus Gregg,*

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Josephus Gregg,*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Josephus Gregg, and his*

heirs and assigns forever.
