To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 12,130. for 80. acres, issued in favor of *John Sanborn, Corporal in Captain Chamberlain's Company, Maine Volunteers* *Wain of 1812.*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *East half of the South West quarter of Section twenty, in Township thirty four, of Range five, West, in the District of lands subject to sale at Mendon, Indiana, containing eighty acres.*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *which has been assigned unto Henry S. Adams,*

Henry S. Adams, Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Henry S. Adams,*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Henry S. Adams, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
