To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 11-006 for 40 acres, issued in favor of Henry Palmer, Private in Captain Scribner's company New York Militia Mar 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South West <sup>quarter</sup> of the South East quarter of Section Twenty Four in Township Thirty-Four, Range Five West in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Winamac Indiana, containing Forty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: which has been assigned unto John B. Vail

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said John B. Vail

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John B. Vail and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
