Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 42331 for 80 acres, issued in favor of Joseph Navane Minor Child of Alex. D. Alex. Navane, Private Captain Lapsells Company Michigan Militia War 1812

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Charles E. De Wolfe

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Charles E. De Wolfe and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
