Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 46655 for 80 acres,

ing eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: which has been assigned to Mark E Reeves and James Pullan

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Mark E Reeves and James Pullan

the tract of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Mark E Reeves and James Pullan and to their

heirs and assigns forever.
