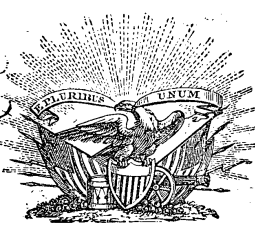


The United States of America.

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850,

entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 45742 for 80 acres,

issued in favor of Anne P. Anderson, Widow, of John B. Anderson, Sargent in Captain Taylor's Company Virginia Militia

May 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

North half of the North quarter of section twenty six, in Township thirty four, of Range five west, in the District of Lands, subject to sale at Winamac, Indiana, containing eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

John B. Vacl

the tract of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John B. Vacl and his
