Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. *sp 162* for *80* acres, issued in favor of *Anw Gaston, Widow of Robert Gaston. Private in Captain Ford's Company First Regiment South Carolina Militia*

May 18 1852

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *East half of the North East quarter of section thirty, in Town ship thirty five, of Range five North, in the District of lands subject to sale at Vincennes, Indiana containing eighty acres*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *Which has been assigned to David M. Dunn*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *David M. Dunn and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
