To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 17102 for 80 acres, issued in favor of John Dull Private and ^{fourth} Sergeant in Captains Moore and Adams Companies New York Volunteers

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the East half of the North West quarter of section thirty five in Township thirty three North of Range seven West in the District of lands subject to sale at Indianapolis Indiana containing eighty acres

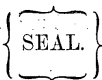

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Saranus Noble

the tract of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Saranus Noble and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
