To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 58498 for 80 acres, issued in favor of Robert George Private in Captain Whites Company Pennsylvania Volunteers War 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the West half of the South West quarter of section twelve in Township thirty two of Range five west, in the District of Lands formerly subject to sale Menomac now Indianapolis Indiana containing eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: Which has been of you given to Mark Eward Reeves

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Mark Eward Reeves

the Tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Mark Eward Reeves and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Franklin Pierce PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
