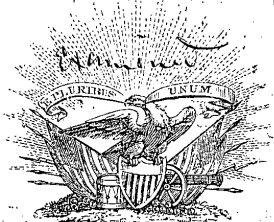

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 56,232... for 40... acres, issued in favor of *Burrell Webb, Private Captain Patterson's Company Georgia Militia, Mar 1812, having been assigned by the said Burrell Webb, to Robert W. Simms and Thomas G. Simms, and by them to William Russell, and*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *North East quarter of the South East quarter of Section thirty six, in township thirty five, of Range seven West, in the District of Lands formerly subject to sale at Vincennes, now Indianapolis, Indiana, containing forty acres,*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

Now Know Ye; That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *William Russell*

the Tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *William Russell and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *Andrew Johnson* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
