To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847,

George C. Young, Private Captain Wheels Company Mounted Volunteers,

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in his favor, numbered W. J. 056,

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto Henry M. Rose, assignee of said George C. Young, and to his heirs, the North East quarter, of Section Nine, in Township Merly Three North, of Range Five, West, in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Vincennes, Indiana, containing one Hundred and Sixty acres.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said quarter section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Henry M. Rose, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, Zachary Taylor, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
